Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs

- In geography we explore different materials which link and support knowledge such as atlas's and globes. Children are taught how to correctly read and use them.
- In geography we create a safe space for children to have a voice which enables them to express their own opinions surrounding the world around us and to be respectfully heard and listened to.
- In geography, we have respect for our fellow pupils and encourage everyone to have the confidence to express their ideas and opinions regarding geographical issues such as pollution, environmental issues, water and globalisation.
- In geography, when comparing and contrasting locations children will also explore the people living in these environments and their own individual liberties.
- Children will have the freedom of making their own choices and decisions about the world, the children also know that there are boundaries and which must be respected.
- Mutual respect is taught and given when children are expressing their opinions and beliefs about different geographical parts of the world and societies within in them.

Mutual Respect

- Children are taught and encouraged to show respect to each other's beliefs, feelings and opinions by giving each child a forum to share these on with the expectation that these must be listened to.
- In geography, children will consider questions regarding how different cultures live and work throughout the world.
- Children have the opportunity to explore how areas have changed and how the diverse needs in society has changed them.

Additional Opportunities:

Children have the opportunity to go on local walks throughout the school year. Children visit and have the chance to see many different things in their local area.
